A Note From Our Spiritual Leader

Each and every Passover we are taught to see ourselves as being liberated from slavery in Egypt. *Miztrayim* (Egypt), from the Hebrew root צרר meaning "narrow," is not about a specific place, but rather a narrow state of mind or set of circumstances that obstructs our ability to live healthy and satisfying lives.

The rabbis invite us to draw inspiration from the Passover story and dream a journey of freedom that applies to our own lives and the societies in which we live. Redemption is not a one-time occurrence that happened to our ancestors thousands of years ago; it is an ongoing experience that requires our utmost attention.

We are invited to ask ourselves many questions. What are the narrow places of our time? What are the vulnerable spots? Who are the Pharaohs? Who are the oppressors? Who are the victims? Who are the marginalized? What must be done to free ourselves and our neighbors from such negative circumstances?

In answering these questions, Rabbi Arthur Waskow wants us to consider a "truthful" economics as a path to liberation, with an ecological world-view that is nurturing for all, and committed to "an inclusive democratic economy and an ecologically attuned planet, instead of obedience to top-down corporations." He urges us to contemplate the kind of changes we would have to make in order to carve out a new transformational future for the planet.

Reciting Psalm 118:5 can help us reflect upon and awaken to the voice of wisdom and possibility in our movement toward freedom and positive transformation.
