Rabbi's Corner:

Shalom all -

Most people ask me, upon discovering where I am in the summer, is there Jewish life in Northern Michigan? Before our arrival, Menachem and I didn't know either.

Yes. There is Jewish life in Northern Michigan. And it is especially lively in the summer. We are fortunate to have been able to visit three congregations besides B'nai Israel in Petoskey. They are all connected to B'nai Israel via the consortium.

On our tour to the UP we stopped at Temple Beth Sholom in Marquette. The president Daniel Arnold proudly led us to the place and showed us this quaint Jewish center in midst of this beautiful University City.



We then dropped in at Temple Jacob in Hancock and discovered a historical site on the Keweenaw Peninsula in which the congregation dates back to 1889. The Jews of Hancock were part of the copper industry. They built their small, unique Temple in 1912 via the generosity of Jacob Gartner. The building is a gem. The Jewish population is very small there today but is led by dedicated members. Susan Burack, past president of the Temple, proudly showed us around and shared her hopes for a growing Jewish school and yearly celebrations.

Last week we went to Sault Ste. Marie where Gil and Ginny Cymbalist took a whole day to show us their town and I was fortunate to teach a class at night at which 10 people arrived at a last minute notice.

Yale Strom on violin, Elizabeth Schwartz, vocals, and Peter Stan on accordion provide a memorable musical experience. Strom, a leading artist-ethnographer collects and researches music in Romania and is one of the foremost authorities on Klezmer music and its connection to Roma (Gypsy) music.

Klezmer music, for those not familiar with it, is folk music of the Jews of Eastern Europe. Itinerant Klezmer groups provided music at weddings and Bar Mitzvahs, and still do. When Jews immigrated to America from 1880 to 1924, Klezmer was influenced by jazz and vice versa. A Klezmer revival began in the '70s and has made the energetic music more popular around the world. Barbara will share the story of how 15 years of research, interviews, and travel informed her debut novel, and the process enhanced her understanding of the Holocaust and the important considerations in preserving a family story.

need to be active and make it happen. It is a burden on a small group. To us it seems a miracle that Jews who have no Rabbi, nor most of them, a student Rabbi, still sustain Jewish activity. Some meet once a month, others only on holidays but there is on-going communication.

It reminded us of the little shtetls in Eastern Europe in the 18th century. Petoskey's B'nai Israel impresses us as the biggest and most active (we are of course very objective). That means that although small yourselves, you have a precious gift to offerit is your experience and your numbers and your ongoing dedication and love of Jewish Tradition. Sharing is strengthening. By giving, you are also taking, or as a Jewish homily states - to light a candle from a candle the one keeps burning and the other lacks naught.


