A Note From Our Spiritual Leader

December aligns with the month of Kislev, with Torah readings that feature the power of dreams. In parshat Vayetzei, God appears to Jacob in a dream with angels ascending and descending a ladder. God promises Jacob land and a safe journey back to Canaan. When Jacob awakens, he recognizes that God is with him. In parshat Vayeshev, Joseph relates prophetic dreams to his brothers of eventually ruling over them, which causes them to become so envious that they throw him into a pit. In parshat Miketz, Joseph interprets the dreams of Pharaoh and is rewarded with the appointment of viceroy over Egypt.

Talmud teaches that a dream is one-sixtieth of prophecy and as a result an uninterpreted dream is likened to a letter left unread. Figuring out the meaning of our dreams can help bring buried or unresolved thoughts and feelings to the surface. There are many techniques for interpreting dreams. To help remember our dreams, we may want to keep a journal by our bedside so we can easily jot down details. There are also many books on exploring dream life. One book that offers a Jewish perspective is **Entering the Temple of Dreams** by Tamar Frankiel and Judy Greenfeld.

As Hannukah approaches, during the darkest month of the year, it is important to look for light wherever we can. In addition to paying attention to our dreams, the Hanukkah candles themselves may offer a spiritual pathway to the light. According to the Hassidic master Sefat Emet, the Hanukkah candles signify the light of mitzvot, instruments that help us discover the hidden divine light within ourselves. As it says in **Proverbs 20:27**, "the human soul is the lamp of God that searches the inner chambers."

May the light within you shine brightly!
