

### **Lay Leadership Conference**

The temple, through Ravitz Foundation's Small Congregations Initiative, will host a free Lay Leadership Seminar in the last weekend of January. Participants will learn about rites, such as B'rit Milah and funeral conduction, as well as how to lead Shabbat services in a Rabbi's absence.

Rabbi Matt Zerwekh, a former student rabbi in Petoskey who now resides in Kalamazoo, will lead the seminar this month. He brings warmth, wit, and knowledge of small congregations' challenges.

The seminar is open to all Petoskey Temple members, L'Dor V'Dor congregation members, and Kalamzoo Temple members. Enrollment will be limited to 15 students. Participants must have excellent public speaking skills, and familiarity with Hebrew will be useful. Above all, they must have the willingness to lead Shabbat services when called upon.

The seminar will begin on Friday evening and conclude Sunday afternoon. Participants must be present all three days.
