



The Roster Project

The Shapell Manuscript Foundation created the Roster Project, a database of Jewish soldiers that fought in the Civil War on both sides. They have verified thousands of soldiers as Jewish, identified their service, and will be making the information public online!

They hope to engage the public with primary source material--the human side of history--while significantly modifying the scholarship on Jews in America in the 19th and early 20th centuries.
