#### **Holocaust Cellist Concert**

On Friday, May 20, join us at the Crooked Tree Arts Center to celebrate the musical genius of Richard Stöhr, an 20th-century cellist who was exiled from Austria when the Nazis invaded and whose work has gone largely unpublished and unrecognized.

Cellist Stefan Koch and pianist Robert Conway will perform a variety of Stöhr's pieces at 8 p.m. on the 20th. Adult tickets cost \$10; students' cost \$5. Children under twelve are free.

This event is part of a block-booking activity offered by the L'Dor v'Dor Consortium and is made possible by a grant from the Jewish Women's Foundation of Metropolitan Detroit.
