A Note From Our Spiritual Leader

We are now in the middle of the seven-week period of counting the omer. The counting begins on the second night of Passover and ends right before Erev Shavuot. In Torah, the omer refers to the first offering of the new barley harvest, made on the second day of Passover. The next new grain offering was made on Shavuot in the form of 2 loaves made from the new wheat harvest.

The post-temple Shavuot festival that we celebrate today is no longer focused on an agricultural harvest, but rather, the rabbis reinterpret it as marking the time of the giving of the Torah at Sinai. In the kabbalistic vision, the counting of the omer invites us to see ourselves as traveling through the wilderness like the Israelites. The 49 days gives us an opportunity to work on ourselves and refine our character in preparation for Shavuot when we renew our commitment to receiving Torah and being in a covenantal relationship with God.

In the kabbalistic system of counting, each week of the omer relates to a specific Divine attribute of the tree of life: hesed (loving kindness), gevurah (power, judgment), tiferet (beauty, glory, inner balance), netzach (triumph, endurance), hod (splendor, gratitude, acknowledgement), yesod (foundation, creative impulse) and malkhut (authority, mastery, manifestation). On each day of the omer, we are to focus on the relationship of a single attribute embedded within the attribute of the week (e.g. chesed within chesed, gevurah within chesed, etc). There are books and apps available to explore embarking on this particular psycho-spiritual journey (see resources below).

We begin the first week of this month focused on *netzach*, the quality of endurance, that helps us keep the fires of faith, enthusiasm and inspiration aflame in our daily actions. Hope is embedded in endurance and in the belief that there is light at the end of the tunnel, that there is a higher purpose to our actions, that something good will come out of our effort and that there is nobility in the very act of trying.

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


