### Rabbi's Corner:

According to the community members with whom I have spoken, this is the first winter in a long time that not one Student Rabbi visit has been canceled due to weather. You may choose to thank God or global warming for this mini-miracle, but regardless, it has been quite a remarkable winter. Rebbitzen Jill and I have been so delighted to see your beaming faces every time we visit. Not once did we count less than a minyan at any of our services. Speaking of counting, we will be doing more counting shortly. In Leviticus 23:15-16 the ancient Hebrews were instructed to count seven weeks between the holidays of Passover and Shavuot. During those seven weeks, the Hebrews were to rededicate themselves to God. They should bring offerings to the Temple daily, they may not get married, they must refrain from wearing new clothes, they may bathe only for hygienic reasons, and may not cut their hair.

In celebration of the Omer, I will be growing a beard (with Jill's approval). Please know when you see me next, I am letting my hygiene slip with reason. If you wish to join with me we will maintain our beards until Lag B'Omer on May 2<sup>nd</sup>, when we will celebrate with our first ever Lag B'Omer BBQ— fun with food and music!

# **Temple Plans Mitzvah Project**

As we sit down at our Passover Seder each year, we raise our matzo and recite: "This is the bread of persecution. Let all who are hungry, come and eat with us. Let all who are in want, come share the hope of Passover." What do those words mean to us today?

Passover is not only a celebration of being freed from Egypt, but also a commandment to free others. Today, the statistics around the depth and breadth of hunger and poverty in America are staggering: 17.6 million food insecure households, making up 49.1million people. To address poverty in our community, our Temple will launch a congregation-wide Mitzvah Project this season. We will provide and serve a noon meal at the Presbyterian Soup Kitchen, which feeds anyone comes The kitchen is open on Thursdays and Sundays. Temple Sisterhood will start the ball rolling and will invite both men and women to help. Watch your email for actual times and dates and how you can volunteer.

Passover is one of my favorite holidays, and regrettably it comes but once year. Yet its celebration serves as a constant reminder that in order to address issues of poverty, we must engage ourselves all year-round.
